**Len Ainslie** – Nothing to report.

<u>Siobhan Samson</u> – Planning on the 5 pipe bridges from Ineos is very vague. Any future plans on the site where the new Power Station could affect A904 if it is built close to or on part of the area. There is pre-planning information available about this on the DPEA website.

The Grangemouth Community Council is standing by its written representation. Bo'ness Community Council will be taking part in the relevant hearing sessions. Siobhan is checking the alternate driving route with the planning committee.

<u>Councillor David Aitchison</u> – Mary Pitcaithly, the Chief Executive of Falkirk Council, is retiring.

Newtown Park Association – The Association has received 250k for the New Astroturf pitch and floodlights. Consultants have been engaged to develop the forthcoming Hub.

Community Bus - After the Town Hall meeting, which was well-attended, it was agreed that the Community Bus would stick to the motorway route.

<u>Councillor Lynn Munro</u> – Falkirk Council budget discussions are ongoing.

<u>Alan Gilbert</u> – Cowdenhill Community Centre repairs are ongoing and funding is being sourced. Sandy Turner is the current acting chair and the committee are not keen to buy the hall until much-needed repairs have been met. They are looking for more groups to use the building, which is a very versatile and affordable space.

**E-mail to Community Councils** advising that Mark Ruskell MSP will be hosting a follow-up meeting for CCs affected by the flight paths at Edinburgh Airport(EA) at 6pm in the Scottish parliament on 24<sup>th</sup> January,2018. You will remember that the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) decided, in September 2017, not to continue its review of EA's application due to a number of technical issues. The meeting is to discuss how Community Councils may work together if and when any future consultation takes place. Joan commented that we have had very few complaints from the community in regard to Edinburgh Airport plans and that the South of Boness will be most affected by any noise. As Joan is away she will try an get someone else to attend on our behalf.
