5. Police Report - Officer in attendance: PC Graeme McDougall

The purpose of this report is to provide the local community and local stakeholders with information on policing issues affecting the Bo'ness and Blackness ward area.

Questions and Answers to the Police Officer

Siobhan Samson asked whether there was an increase or decrease in the statistics for Bo'ness this year. Response: There has been a reduction of 26 incidences this year.

Madelene Hunt asked about the cause of the recent accident at Champany. Response: Driver Error. Alex King commented that he had almost been knocked down on the zebra crossing in the town centre and that there are a lot more incidents now of drivers not stopping for pedestrians. There was also a comment about vehicles driving fast at night in the town.

PC Mc Dougall confirmed that the cameras are working and monitored.

Madelene Hunt suggested that perhaps introducing speed bumps may help to stop driving at speed. The issue of continuing car thefts was also asked about. Response: We are aware that a group from Edinburgh is coming into the town for this purpose.

The Brown Bin garden refuse collection will affect everyone and has been moved to a monthly collection.

The X 49 bus service has been withdrawn.

The Kinneil Nursery is to be closed. A community interest Company (CIC) has asked for a meeting with Rhona Geisler with a view to taking this on. The group run an education project. A meeting has been arranged on Friday to discuss the potential.

7. A.O.C.B.

Planning meeting 7th March 2019

We agreed our main priority at the moment is to improve Communication and Engagement with the Community:

- Get out into the community and get involved with community groups to obtain common goals
- Use the Journal to promote community council activities and projects
- More fully utilise social media (website, face book, twitter)
- Get better at sharing knowledge of what's going on
- Make sure we get the key messages out into the community

- Buy a couple of Community Council Banners to advertise ourselves at events etc
- Develop a 10 question survey monkey questionnaire to obtain Community views
- Contact the Schools about utilising School Bag drops for important messages or surveys where appropriate
- Utilise youth groups and school connections to engage more with our young people

Potential Projects to be further discussed:

- Promote the town Celebrate Scottish Year of SEA and link with John Muir's Birthday 19.4.2020 - Potential partners -Visit Scotland, Buzzness, SRPS, Friends of Kinneil, Falkirk Council, HES. The next funding round closes June 2019
- Renovation of the Band Stand at the Town Hall Potential partners, Buzzness, Falkirk Council, HES- opportunities for open air concerts, open air cinema
- Adventure Trail along the fore shore potential partners Falkirk Council.

Miller Homes, North Bank Farm

In addition to the requirement for affordable homes, we also agreed the biggest issue for the community is Borrowstoun Road. A Planning Application has been made in regard to road improvement. The earliest decision deadline is 5th April 2019.
