<u>Matters Arising:</u> Following our recent letter, it has been confirmed that Boness Harbour is owned by Falkirk Council (FC). With regard to the clearance of the debris, D Thallon, Environment Coordinator, confirmed on 13 November that a site inspection will take place to ascertain the scale of the problem, however, it seems likely that FC will need to engage specialist contractors to remove debris rather than rely on the litter team. Once an understanding of the potential costs of removing the debris is understood, FC can then advise whether the resources are available from their existing limited maintenance budget to pay for the necessary works. JB will write asking for an update.
